Solar projects proposed for West Lindsey

There are four nationally significant infrastructure projects (NSIP) proposed for West Lindsey. If granted permission they would generate 2.08GW (Giga Watt) of energy. This is almost 40 per cent of the total energy generation of the projects proposed across the East Midlands (5.3 GW) and more than 12 per cent of the projects proposed across Great Britain (17.1 GW).

NSIPs are not decided through the normal local planning processes, which means that West Lindsey District Council is **not** the decision making body for this application. They will go to the Government Minister for Business, energy and Industrial Strategy, via its Planning Inspectorate, for a Development Consent Order (DCO)
