Elections May 2023

With reference to the elections to be held on Thursday 4 May 2023. We thought it would be useful, for all parties concerned, to clarify a few points of what will be required during the nomination process.

On 9 May 2023 the terms of office of all councillors will come to an end and if they wish to stand again Nomination Papers must be completed and submitted. Hard copy sets of nomination papers will be sent to Parish Clerks early next year and these will also be available on our website.

Nomination Papers **must be delivered by hand** to the Deputy Returning Officers at the Guildhall, Marshall's Yard, Gainsborough on any working day between the hours of 10 am and 4pm. Appointments must be made to help us and the candidates as we will be receiving between 500 and 600 sets of parish nominations plus the District papers. The first day for delivery of nominations is Monday 13 March 2023 and the deadline for delivery is 4pm on Tuesday 4 April 2023. Nomination papers must not be dated before the Notice of Election, 13 March 2023.

To try and save any issues when the papers are brought into the office it would be advisable to read the instructions that go with the nomination packs, information such as no abbreviations, Street not St, Avenue not Ave. The witness on the Candidate Consent form must be the same person who witnesses the Home Address form and both part 1 and part 2 of the Home Address section, even if part 2 is not used, must be returned. It is better to return everything rather than us having to reject a paper. The polling district and elector number of the proposer and seconder, who must live within the parish and be on the electoral register, can be supplied by us on the day the papers are delivered or by calling the office beforehand. It is also important to note we are only able to make very minor alterations to the papers and informal checks can be carried out before they are officially submitted.

If a candidate wishes to withdraw from standing for election this must be done by 4pm on 4 April 2023.

All candidates will be sent a set of Expense forms and these must be completed and returned to us by the deadline even if it is a 'nil' return.

Following the close of nominations, if there are fewer than, or the same number, of candidates to seats, they will be declared elected uncontested. If there are more

validly nominated candidates than there are seats there will be a poll on 4 May 2023. Please note uncontested elections still have administration charges.

Waste Services Christmas and New Year - your waste questions answered!

Each year West Lindsey District Council is asked by residents what they need to do with regards to their Christmas and New Year's waste collections and recycling. So we have put together some handy tips as part of our 'Right Thing, Right Bin' campaign, which we have been working alongside Lincolnshire Recycles to ensure that correct items get recycled over the festive period.

Bin collections over the Christmas Period will be as follows:-

Normal Collection Day	Revised Collection Day
Monday 26 December	Tuesday 27 December
Tuesday 27 December	Wednesday 28 December
Wednesday 28 December	Thursday 29 December
Thursday 29 December	Friday 30 December
Friday 30 December	Saturday 31 December

As there is no dedicated collection for Christmas trees, we ask that these are either taken to a local household waste recycling centre (HWRC), or chopped up and placed in residents' garden waste bins for when collections restart.

Household Waste Recycling Centres are closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day.

- Please see below some reminders from our 'Right Thing, Ring Bin' campaign over the Christmas and New Year period.

What cannot go in your blue recycling bin?

- Crisp tubes and packets
- Glitter/shiny wrapping paper
- Dirty tinfoil
- Plastic bags (or any recycling contained within plastic bags)
- Bubble wrap
- Polystyrene packaging
- Old or broken plastic toys

What cannot go in your purple lidded bin?

- Crisp tubes (such as Pringles)
- Glittery shiny/glitter wrapping paper
- Drinks cartons (these need to be in your blue bin)
- Shredded paper
- Tissues/wipes/kitchen roll
- Takeaway cardboard pizza/food boxes

Christmas crackers

Separate your crackers out once you've used them. Any cardboard and paper can be recycled, as long as it doesn't have any glitter or foil on it.

Other items, such as plastics, ribbons, or any foil or glittery card needs to go in your general waste bin.

Please note: If items cannot go in your purple lidded bin then they will need to go in your black bin (with the exception of drinks cartons).
